The first guide to introduce here is Marcel Anker, researcher of C Company, 2nd Parachute Battalion and author of 'The Lost Company'.

C Company was one of the founder airborne units and carried out the first coordinated airborne operation of the Second World War: The Bruneval Raid in February 1942.

On 17th September 1944, 113 men from the Company dropped onto DZ X. At the end of their battle only four of them returned on Operation Berlin. During the battle nine members were killed of whom four have no known grave. The other five are resting in this cemetery. The talk today will tell the story of three of them.



Graham has also helped with a number of Arnhem books including Desert Rise Arnhem Descent and the revised nominal rolls in the recent reprints of Off at Last, The Shiny Ninth and A Sapper at Arnhem. He also wrote a chapter of our 75th commemoration book and has contributed a number of items to our newsletter, including an article on Captain Alfons Mackowiak of the 1st Polish (Independent) Parachute Brigade.

Thirdly, David van Buggenum who has had a long standing interest in B Company of the 2nd Parachute Battalion and interviewed many of the veterans from the Company. B Company at Arnhem had the objective of taking the pontoon bridge in western Arnhem but before this had to clear the railway station at Oosterbeek Laag of German opposition who were doing their best to hold up the 2nd Parachute Battalion. At Arnhem 13 men of the Company were killed and David will be looking at the following men:



The fourth guide helping today is Niall Cherry who should be well known to many of you as a serial author on the airborne forces in WW2, tour guide and a previous Secretary of the Fellowship. He is going to look at a few casualties from the 10th Parachute Battalion who are buried in Oosterbeek

The 10th Parachute Battalion can trace its origins back to the Western Desert in late 1942 when the 2nd Battalion of the Royal Sussex Regiment was converted into a parachute unit. A number of the Class of September 1944 were originals from that time but many were not and the men we will look at are a mixture of these. The 10th suffered heavy casualties at Arnhem and were disbanded when the few survivors got back to England after the Battle.

Out of the 600 or so men of the 10th Battalion that went into action in Holland somewhere between 40 and 60 returned on Operation Berlin. 93 were killed during the battle or would die later because of wounds received during the fighting or ill-treatment during captivity. So around 90% of the Battalion became a 'casualty' of one sort or the other.



Lastly, the Chairman of the Fellowship David Locke, who has had a lifelong interest in the Border Regiment in which a relative served at Arnhem. He will be covering a number of men from the 1st Battalion Border Regiment. The Battalion objectives for Operation Market Garden were firstly to defend the dropping and landing zones for the 17th/18th September and then to protect the western perimeter as it formed as part of the Divisional area. The Battalion were only one of two units that managed successfully to complete their predeployment objectives.
